
## DEHLY/A 22

Both the Dehlya 22 and Dehlya 25 class yachts benefit from our professional approach to yacht building – a good standard of finish – easy and quick to assemble.

The modern 7/8 rig is so easy to handle for a family cruising with young children or for short-handed sailing. The yachts sail well under their powerful main sails with headsails furled or lowered. These Dehler/Van de Stadt yachts are so pretty indeed elegant in their general design. With a fair, sweet and easily driven line to the hull sections coupled to shallow draft and excellent stability with the keel raised, they are indeed a joy to sail.



Good security on deck especially for young children with our carefully designed Pulpit, Pushpit, Stancheons and Guard Rails. Also the special cork/rubber anti slip deck surface.





With our kit (Packet) No. 4 the cockpit seats, cockpit sole and combings can be trimmed with Teak.



Halyards and quick reef line to the main sail lead aft to the security of the cockpit through stoppers (rope clutches) to winches.

The Dehlya 22 performs well under power using a light weight 4/6 H.P. outboard motor mounted on our quick raising and lowering system to reduce drag under sail – also convenient when the yacht is being launched and recovered to the road trailer.

The spacious interior giving four good berths (curtain separation between the forepeak and saloon accommodation), minimum size 2m long by at least 65 c.m. wide at the shoulders for comfort. Locker stowage under the berths and out board against the ship's side plus stowage pockets in the forepeak. Attractively finished with a light, bright interior plus the convenience of a galley extends your living comfort below decks.



The folding pramhood so convenient in harbour or under sail improves standing headroom and helps to maintain a dry and well ventilated interior in all weather conditions.



A tent designed to fit the Dehlya 22 illustrated extends the living accommodation on board for the longer sailing holidays.
